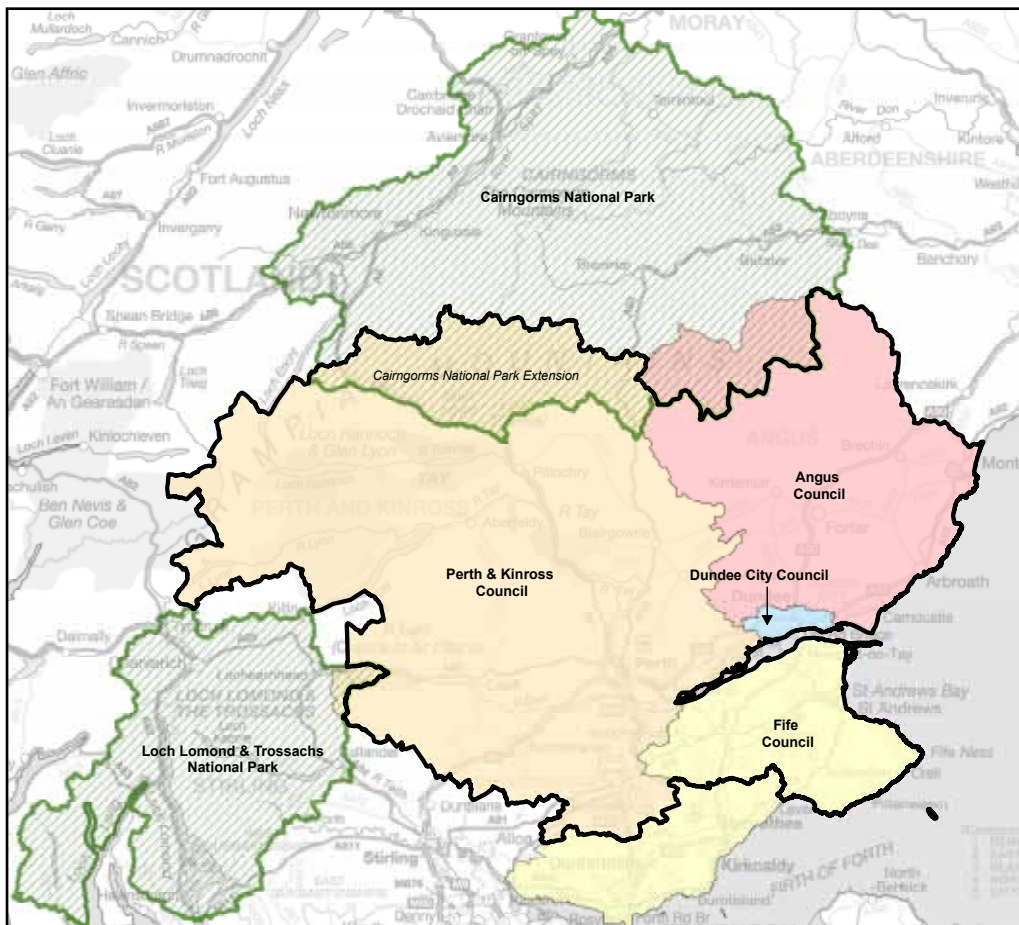

# 1 Introduction

- 1.1 The Strategic Development Planning Authority (SDPA) operates on behalf of Dundee City, Perth & Kinross, Angus and Fife Councils. The key role of the SDPA is to prepare and maintain an up to date Strategic Development Plan for the area.
- 1.2 The area covered by the Strategic Development Plan is illustrated on Map 1. This covers the local authority administrative areas of Dundee, Perth & Kinross, Angus and the north part of Fife. The approved Strategic Development Plan area however excludes the Cairngorms National Park and Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park areas within local authority boundaries. This boundary is in the process of being revised to exclude the Cairngorms National Park extension as shown in map below. This is expected to take effect in early 2013.

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- 1.3 The TAYplan Joint Committee comprises 12 Councillors, three from each of the 4 constituent Local Authorities. The Joint Committee meets at least twice a year in TAYplan’s offices. Committee Reports are available from the TAYplan website at [www.tayplan-sdpa.gov.uk](http://www.tayplan-sdpa.gov.uk). The current chair is Cllr John Kellas (Perth & Kinross Council) and the vice-chair is Cllr Mairi Evans (Angus Council).

## 2 The Development Plan System in Scotland

- 2.1 The Development Plan system in Scotland consists of three core statutory documents:
  - i) **The National Planning Framework (NPF) for Scotland.** This is produced by the

Scottish Government and sets out the Scottish Government's strategy for Scotland's spatial development, including national developments, and the priorities for that development. The Scottish Government have commenced the preparation of NPF3.

ii) **The Strategic Development Plan.** This is prepared by the Strategic Development Planning Authorities in Scotland's four city regions. This Plan will set out a long-term (20 years or more) development strategy indicating, in broad terms, where future development will be located and what is needed to deliver it. The Plan is approved by Scottish Ministers.

iii) **The Local Development Plan.** This is prepared by all local authorities. This Plan will set out more detailed policies and proposals to guide development. The Plan, which is approved by the local authority, must be consistent with the approved Strategic Development Plan.

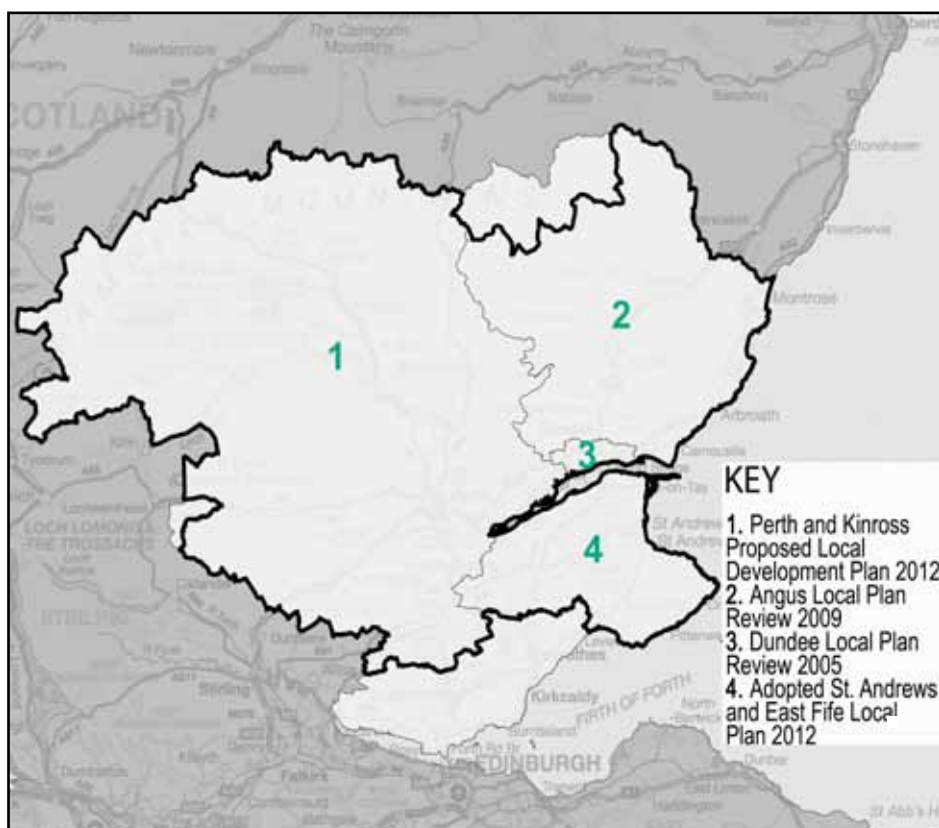
2.2 The Strategic Development Plan and Local Development Plans collectively form the statutory Development Plan for the TAYplan area. In addition, Supplementary Planning Guidance on specific planning topics may be prepared and form part of the statutory Development Plan.

### 3 Existing and Proposed Development Plans

3.1 The TAYplan Strategic Development Plan, was approved in June 2012 and replaced the existing Dundee and Angus Structure Plan (2001-2016), the Perth and Kinross Structure Plan (2003-2020) and the Fife Structure Plan (2006-2026) relating to those parts of Fife within the TAYplan area (North Fife). The TAYplan Strategic Development Plan will cover the area as set out in Map 1.

3.2 The coverage of existing Local Plans within the TAYplan area is set out in Map 2. More information on current Local Development Plans and the timetables for the preparation of the Local Development Plans can be obtained on each of the constituent Councils' web sites.

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## 4 Reviewing the Strategic Development Plan

4.1 The first Strategic Development Plan was approved by ministers in June 2012. Planning legislation requires the Plan to be reviewed, and for the subsequent plan to be submitted to Ministers within four years of the current plans approval. As such, TAYplan is required to renew and submit the Strategic Development Plan by 8th June 2016.



## 5 Collaborative Partnership Working

5.1 TAYplan has delivered the first Proposed Plan through working in collaboration with a number of public sector partners.

TAYplan's Key Stakeholder group comprises 13 public sector agencies. TAYplan considers collaborative working to be central to the Strategic Development Plan process. Gaining respect and trust has been and continues to be central in working together. This partnership working will continue to be central to the review and preparation of the next Plan.



## 6 Timetable for Strategic Development Planning Authority

6.1 A Project Plan has been approved for the preparation of the second Strategic Development Plan. The timetable is set out overleaf from October 2012 for key areas of work. The Development Plan Scheme is required to be published at least annually and any changes to the timetable will be addressed at this time. Regular updates are provided through the TAYplan website ([www.tayplan-sdpa.gov.uk](http://www.tayplan-sdpa.gov.uk)).

6.2 The review of the Plan will commence with research across a wide range of issues to help inform the Main Issues Report and thereafter the Proposed Plan. Prior to the Main Issues Report, TAYplan will provide an opportunity for comments to be submitted on what people and organisations consider are the key issues to be addressed and for any potential strategic development sites/land to be submitted for consideration. This is not a formal consultation stage. This allows an opportunity for reflection on the approved Strategic Development Plan and what new national policies and strategies have emerged since, to inform what the key issues may be in reviewing the Plan. This stage will be the first stage of engagement and is proposed for May-June 2013.
